CONFLICT OF INTEREST

WHAT IS A CONFLICT OF INTEREST?

A conflict of interest arises when outside or personal interests adversely affect an individual's ability to make an impartial decision.

EXAMPLE:

A Tribal Official owns a business and wants his or her company to bid on a contract with the Tribe, this is a conflict of interest.

WHEN DEALING WITH CONFLICTS OF INTEREST, IT'S IMPORTANT TO KNOW THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN A POTENTIAL CONFLICT AND AN ACTUAL CONFLICT.

POTENTIAL CONFLICT

The fact that the Tribal Official owns the company is a potential conflict.

ACTUAL CONFLICT

If the Tribal Official contracts with the Tribe, then that is an actual conflict of interest and requires action.

TRANSPARENCY IS IMPORTANT WHEN DEALING WITH BOTH ACTUAL AND POTENTIAL CONFLICTS OF INTEREST.

QUESTIONS TO ASK YOURSELF WHEN ADDRESSING CONFLICTS OF INTEREST:

Do you have outside or personal influences that affect a transaction?

Do you have information that should be disclosed?

Did you use Professional Judgement in deciding to participate in decisions and/or discussions?
