It starts at the top. To foster a strong ethical culture, leadership must lead by example and uphold ethical values.

The **tone at the top** is the message, attitude and image conveyed by leadership and reflects a commitment to principles, values and character.

A poor tone at the top increases the likelihood of unethical behavior at all levels.

To improve the Tribe's tone at the top:

- Communicate, promote, and display ethics and values;
- Encourage the report of misconduct; and
- Recognize and reward integrity.

While tone at the top is critical, leadership cannot ignore the **middle** and **bottom**. Training and resources must be provided to ensure the right message trickles down.

After Hogan Controversy, Maryland Passes New Ethics Law

Gov. Wes Moore signed into law a bipartisan overhaul of the state's ethics laws requiring future governors to put their financial holdings in a blind trust or disinvest from them entirely.

The legislation was triggered by a TIME report last October on former Mayland Gov. Larry Hogan's approval of millions of dollars in affordable housing awards to his real estate firm's listed clients.

A subsequent story found one of the projects was being developed on Hogan's family property.
